



## Training in Abortion Care (TAC) Program **Application Guidance**

Nurses for Sexual and Reproductive Health's Training in Abortion Care (TAC) Program aims to address the need for more full-spectrum clinical training opportunities for registered nurses within the scope of practice in their given region. TAC pairs highly motivated registered nurses with clinical partners that provide full-spectrum sexual and reproductive healthcare for hands-on learning of procedures, particularly abortion care. In addition to clinical training, learners will also receive interprofessional programming to support their development as advocates for reproductive rights and justice.

**Applications must be submitted online by midnight Friday November 13, 2020.** Applicants will be notified in mid/late December on whether or not they have been accepted. For any questions or issues with application submission, please email [programs@nsrh.org](mailto:programs@nsrh.org).

### **Important Notes about TAC**

- The hands-on clinical scope of the trainee is determined by the nursing scope of practice as defined by state law where the training takes place.
- This is not an employment program and participants will not be paid any compensation by the training sites.
- NSRH is not a health center or clinical site and does not provide any direct patient care.
- For this cycle, malpractice insurance will be provided by the clinic providing the training. There may be supplemental information required from the applicant once accepted

The online clinical training application will require approximately 30 minutes to complete. A resume/CV and reference will be required. Below are application questions you may want to prepare before starting the application online:

- What is your primary interest or reason for seeking training with NSRH?
- Identify up to three clinical/educational/advocacy goals you want to accomplish during this training program.
- How do you plan to use the training you receive through this program and how you plan to integrate SRH into your future work?
- How would receiving this training impact the community in which you currently work or plan to work?
